Earn your Girl Scout badges with us! All our programs are written and designed to fulfill many or all requirements for each badge/elective/petal. While many of our programs were created with Girl Scout requirements in mind, our programs are open to any scouting or youth development organizations!

Booking Information

- Groups must be booked a minimum of two weeks in advance.
- Final headcount must be provided one week in advance.
- Groups must provide a minimum of one chaperone for every 10 children.
- All chaperones are free.
- Fishing groups must provide a minimum of one chaperone for every five children unless otherwise mentioned in program description.

Pricing Information

- Fees:
 - 1-hour program: \$70 for 10 scouts, \$6 per additional scout
 - 1.5-hour program: \$90 for 10 scouts, \$8 per additional scout
 - 2-hour program: \$110 for 10 scouts, \$9 per additional scout
 - Specialty programs:
 - Fishing: 2-hour program: \$130 for 10 scouts, \$11 per additional scout
 - Camping: 2-hour program: \$130 for 10 scouts, \$11 per additional scout
- All groups must pay the base amount for a program at the time of booking to guarantee a reservation.
- Final headcount and additional participants will be paid for one week before the date of reservation.
- Cancellations must be made one week prior to the reservation date to receive a refund.

Pink Petal (Make the World a Better Place)

- Make the world a better place! We'll plant some seeds, go on a litter hike, and create a bird feeder or bird house to put in your own backyard.

Clover Petal (Use Resources Wisely)

- Girls will learn all about natural resources and recycling. They will play a recycling game, make recycled art, and brainstorm ways to help reduce their waste and recycle more at home.

Animal Observer

- Take a hike to search for animal clues, observe animals in their natural habitat, and play a fun animal game.

Daisy Trail Adventure

- Have fun planning and going for a hike! Stretch your muscles, then go on a fun hike where you will play all sorts of games while you move.

Math in Nature

- Find shapes and patterns in nature and create your own art. Play with shadows, sort nature objects, and count with birds! Fulfills all requirements for Daisy Shapes, Daisy Numbers, and Daisy Design with Nature.

- Discover how art and nature can combine! Look for colors in nature and make a colorful creation. Go on a hike to listen for nature sounds, and make an art project using the nature items you find on your hike.

Bugs

- Learn all about the little creatures around us! We'll investigate some of the Nature Center's insects and arachnids to learn what makes them special, explore bug homes, and make a fun bug-inspired craft.

Eco Friend

- Become a friend to the environment! Go on an eco-hike, take a closer look at different nature items, and learn how to make a safe campfire (maybe roast some marshmallows too!). Investigate animal homes and brainstorm ways to keep these homes safe.

Hiker

- Determine as a group the hiking path you'll take. Brainstorm what to bring and what to wear for a successful hike. Learn about trail signs and practice reading them. Make trail mix, then put your hiking plan into motion!

Letterboxer

- Become a treasure hunter! Play a game of hide and seek, create your own letterboxing stamp, practice solving word clues, and go on a hunt to find a letterbox.

Math in Nature

- Put those math skills to practice in a fun and engaging way! Observe the natural world around you for patterns, measure some trees, create a graph based around observations, do some calculations, and play some fun math games.

Outdoor Adventurer

- Play a survival game, go on a fun hike to collect items and observe nature, learn how to safely start a campfire (maybe even roast marshmallows!), and make a fun craft to take home and help the wildlife in your backyard.

Pets

- Learn what it takes to have a reptile, amphibian, insect, or small mammal as a pet! Help our staff feed and care for the animals that call the Nature Center home. Discover how they communicate with each other and us, and learn what it takes to have these animals as a pet in your home.

- Observe Nature Center animals and their behavior and learn all about their wild counterparts. Put your art skills to the test as you sketch an animal home. Learn about endangered animal habitats and what we can do to help them.

Flowers

- Discover the fascinating world of flowers! Learn about the parts of a flower, play a game involving flower families, make a fun flower art project, and make your own flower tea.
